2. Day One conferences and general sessions were well attended by elementary students and families. Students had the opportunity to meet their teachers, bring school supplies and learn about the classroom expectations and plans for the upcoming school year. Feedback regarding the structuring of Day One has been positive from parents.

3. 2017-2018 NRHEG Elementary S.M.A.R.T. Goals

- By May 31, we will increase the percentage of students meeting the reading proficiency standards from 62.3% to 70.% as measured by the spring MCA III assessments.
- By May 31, we will increase the percentage of students meeting the math proficiency standards from 83.1% to 85% as measured by the spring MCA III assessments.
- By May 31, we will increase the percentage of students meeting the science proficiency standards from 57.7% to 63.0% as measured by the spring MCA III assessments.
- By the end of the 2017-2018 school year, we will increase the percentage of our Free and Reduced population meeting the reading and math proficiency standards as measured by the spring MCA III assessments and common assessments. Math~from 67.5% to 70.0%. Reading from 47.6% to 51.0%.
- By the end of the 2017-2018 school year, we will increase the percentage of our Special Education population meeting the reading and math proficiency standards as measured by the spring MCA III assessments and common assessments. Math~from 38.5% to 42.0%. Reading from 16.0% to 24.0%
