

Dear NRHEG School District Community Members:

In my first year as the school district's Superintendent, I have been continually impressed with the communities that make up the NRHEG School District. There is the warmth of a small town, a can-do attitude and countless examples of neighbors helping neighbors. I am also impressed with our students' performance both in and out of the classroom and how our staff continually goes above and beyond each and every day to ensure our students learn to their fullest potential.

One of the School Board's major goals is to develop a strategic plan that builds on this solid foundation and answers the following questions:

- ✓ What is our vision for the future?
- ✓ What are our highest priorities?
- ✓ Where do we need to improve?
- ✓ Where should we focus our resources?

Additionally, we need to develop a plan to update our school buildings, constructed 25 to 62 years ago. Our elementary building was constructed in 1963, with an addition in 1993. A significant portion of the secondary building was updated in 1991. The junior high wing was built in 1960 and the gym in 1954. While our schools have been well maintained, many of the spaces are undersized, outdated or insufficient to meet students' current educational needs. The School Board will also look to the survey to answer:

- ✓ What are the community's facility priorities?



The NHREG Public School's tax levy is among the lowest in the region. The 2015 tax levy amount is nearly \$100 less than neighboring Waseca and over \$400 less than JWP.

This funding approach limits NRHEG's ability to fund programs and services for our students.
