Business Education News:

Introduction to Business:

The class completed learning standards in unit one: The Basic Economic Concepts of Business.

Students learned the differences of wants and needs, types of business activities, economic resources, factors of production, and how to make business decisions using the 5-step decision-making model. Students completed a culmination activity, which incorporated all learning targets and was used as a summative assessment for unit one. We are moving into unit 2 - Owning and operating a business, in which students will learn about entrepreneur and entrepreneurship, rewards and challenges, and characteristics of entrepreneurs. Students will learn ethics and social responsibility, and finally, students will learn what a business plan is, the sixteen parts of a business plan, and the culminating activity will be that students will write a business plan which will be used as a summative assessment for unit two.

Computer Applications I:

The class completed learning standards on creating flyers in Microsoft WORD. Students learned how to read and follow technical instructions, format text, insert pictures, and use various picture tools to create effects on the flyer. Students learned how to size and resize fonts and pictures, create borders, and proofread work. We have moved into our second unit in Microsoft WORD, business emails to teachers. Students will learn the six steps of an email, and how to compose emails using the six steps. They will work on request emails and notification emails. Once the learning targets have been met for business emails, we will move into formatting unformatted business letters, using block, and modified block business letters.

Exploratory 8th Grade:

The students are focusing right now on researching the sixteen career clusters. This research will include learning about the skills and education necessary to work in those respective occupations within particular career clusters, including which classes to take in high school to help prepare students for those career goals. We have also been spending time reflecting on the student's skills and interests and how to build the skill set necessary to be successful as they prepare for life beyond high school. As a culminating activity, students will focus on one career that they research, create google slides of their research, and on tri-fold boards, will present their research to other classes. A summative assessment will be on students' oral presentations, looking at such areas as presentation skills, public speaking, and communication skills.

Money Management:

The class has been working on the checking and banking unit. The students learned how to read paystubs, learned what is taken out of checks, and what the tax money is used for. Students also learned how to write a check, learned three ways to endorse a check, and practiced writing out a deposit slip. We are wrapping up writing transactions into a check register and balancing the register. The next few days will be spent on reconciling the check register with the bank statement and learning ways in which to monitor online bank accounts when students may not have a checkbook register. Budgeting will be the next unit, in which students will learn what a budget is, and how to set up a budget. They will create budgets for a cast of characters before students create their own budgets based on their own paychecks and hypothetical paychecks for those who do not have a job as of yet.
