Ben Schlaak is helping us get a DUI simulator here at our school and a speaker about distracted and/or drunk driving. We are looking to do this before graduation (May 18-19). I am excited about this opportunity for our kids!

From Mrs. Rudau: "The last week in October the Ambassadors organized activities connected to Red Ribbon Week. This included a pledge chain that is hanging in the Commons. Students signed a pledge to elect to make positive choices and were given a bracelet with the same phrase. During lunch we took pictures and eventually these pictures will be put on the school web page. Each day had a theme that was introduced by members dealing with a specific choice that is positive. Since we are at 42 members we divided our group in half and this was the focus of Team Red Ribbon.

The second half of the group, Team Veterans, focused on organizing a breakfast and program. The breakfast had 8 veterans and spouses join our students in the Commons. We had students meet them at the back doors, walk them to the breakfast, pour coffee, and visit with them from 7:45 a.m. until 8:30 a.m. It was an amazing experience as students were nervous about mingling, but quickly became very comfortable with the members. The Veteran's Day program will be this Friday and students have taken on reading parts, flag folding, and creating the paper program. In addition to that we also had students interview 5 veterans to introduce them to the student body at the program.

Looking ahead to the future we are planning a quick fundraiser for diabetes right after Thanksgiving. In January we will have a Jump Rope for the Heart event to promote a heart healthy lifestyle."

MS students are attending Tuesday Study Halls. I typically have a group from 8 to 12 students. We have been serving freezer pops, but will switch to Hot Chocolate with the cooler weather.

It is an inspiring group that has been amazing to work with this year. We started in 2013 with a group of 6 and each year have grown. My goal as an advisor is to continue to help them find opportunities to spread positive message within our school and community.
