 have provided a brief reflection on a few of the articles from the December publication. I hope you
 have had an opportunity to read and reflect.
 - <u>Policy, strategy key to increased achievement</u> The author shares his experience as a former superintendent in aligning policies and strategic planning together to positively impact

student learning. He shared a challenging decision and process in which the District put into action a "theory of action" that led to decision making based on what is best for children even though it may not be what is easiest for staff.

- <u>Email response resource helps board</u> The article shares an example in which a superintendent created an e-mail response resource (School Board Member Advice The Email Dilemma) to help board members respond to emails they receive. I have provided a copy for you.
- <u>5 ways to concentrate on better board governance</u> The article provides five areas where board members encounter role confusion and how to handle them including:
 - 1. Respective Roles and Responsibilities Remembering the Board makes policy, supervises the superintendent, and approves a budget while the superintendent is charged with implementing policy and managing the day-to-day operations of the school district.
 - 2. Remembering Board has 1 Employee Board supervises Superintendent and Superintendent is charged with ensuring the rest of employees in the district are properly supervised.
 - 3. Loyalty to the position of board member Board members must always act on behalf of all children in the district.
 - 4. Board functions as a Whole Power is through the full board and not any one individual.
 - 5. Board member power at the Board table Board members power exists only during a duly called board meeting.
- <u>Keep this in mind about your board service</u> The article reinforces that change in policy happens at the Board table and results from the decisions made by the full board and not by any one individual board member.
