2. Professional Development

PLC Meetings were held on Monday, October 9, and Tuesday, October 10. Information regarding each meeting is highlighted below:

On Monday, October 9, we had our first 2 hour professional development late start (8:00 a.m.-10:00 a.m.). Nancy Remmert was working with the secondary staff on this day, and they worked in our PLC teams here at the elementary. As we continue with our focus on creating assessments and instructional guides for reading instruction, I asked that teachers keep in mind the action goals for each focus group area and how, specifically, each team will support these goals at each department, or grade level.

They considered the two areas below during their discussions.

B. How will we use formative and summative assessments to track and assess our students?

1. Focus Group #1 Kindergarten Readiness (a focus for PK-K)

By June 2021, 100 % of NRHEG Kindergarten students will be Kindergarten ready as measured by the Kindergarten Readiness Assessment Tool which will be developed by the Early Childhood and Kindergarten staff during the 2016 - 2017 school year.

2. Focus Group #2 Grade Level Literacy By Third Grade (a focus for PK-Gr. 2)

By 2021, the NRHEG School District will increase proficiency to at least 82% as measured by the MCA III Reading Assessment.

3. Focus Group #3 Closing the Achievement Gap (a focus for all depts. and levels)

By August 2018, every student will demonstrate an increase in academic growth of 2.0 percent in reading and 1.5 percent in Math as measured by the MCA III exam.
