Science, Technology, Engineering, Art, and Math








STEAM is an acronym that stands for Science, Technology, Engineering, Art, and Math. I try to take everything students learn in their classroom and put it all together in the STEAM room. We use the Engineering Design Process - Ask, Imagine, Plan, Create, Test, Improve, and Share - to solve the open-ended problem and encourage students to learn from failure. STEAM gives students the opportunity to develop knowledge through engaging projects they may face in the real world. This class provides a different learning style for students. STEAM is student-led, where kids are trying to solve a problem using past experiences/knowledge. There typically isn't a "right" answer in STEAM, as there are many ways to solve a problem!

STEAM is important for children because it prepares students for the real world, using open-ended real world problems. It requires critical thinking, collaboration, creativity, and communication skills. Most of the activities completed are in teams so they are being creative while learning to work as a team and communicate effectively. Students have to verbally communicate their thoughts and figure out how they can connect their partner's idea to theirs to solve the problem together in a short amount of time.

Important Elementary Information

*Elementary Student Conference Days – September 5, 2023 and September 6, 2023. We are continuously looking for ways to improve our efforts to support communication between our families and our school. Our 1st-5th grade students are still planning one conference per student, and parents and guardians are asked to come to school with their child, at the assigned time to meet with their child's teacher for an individual conference. Bridges and Kindergarten families will meet in small groups for a 40 minute conference.

During these scheduled conference times, teachers will have an opportunity to share with both parents and students information about the grade level curriculum, daily classroom schedules, grading, classroom rules, and student expectations. The time with the teacher will be scheduled for 40 minutes on either Tuesday, September 5 OR Wednesday, September 6. A portion of the conference will be a personal meeting with the teacher. The other portion of the conference will allow time for the teacher to assess and gauge where each student is at academically. This way, the teacher can plan ways to best support your student on the first day of instruction. During the student time with the teacher, parents and/or guardians will have time to fill out the necessary paperwork, and speak with our Physical Education, STEAM, and Music teachers.

After the 40 minute conference, students will be dismissed for the day and will return on Thursday, September 7th for their first full day of school (Bridges/Kindergarten will follow a separate schedule). Conference Days information will be mailed to families during the first part of August, and will be available on the school website nrheg.k12.mn.us. Please contact the elementary office at 507-684-3181 if you have any questions.

School Hours for both sites will be from 8:30 am to 3:05 pm. All elementary students are dismissed at 3:05 p.m. The only students that remain at the elementary site from 3:05 pm to 3:20 pm will be the Ellendale-Geneva bus route students. All New Richland-Hartland students and Ellendale students who walk, and those who are picked up by families, will be leaving at 3:05 pm. Students living in town are asked to not arrive at school before 8:00 a.m.

Elementary (Bridges – 5th Grade) Individual Student Pictures will be taken Tuesday, September 12th. Pictures will be taken in the elementary media center. Photo package information and cost will be available on Day One. Picture money envelopes will be sent home with the students in the Thursday September 7th folders. Please complete the information on the envelope and send with your child with money- (exact change or check written out to *Brant Hemingway Photography*). PLEASE HAVE YOUR CHILD'S PICTURE TAKEN EVEN IF YOU DO NOT PURCHASE A PACKAGE. These pictures are used for our Elementary Memory Book.

Secured Entrance at NRHEG Elementary (East Entrance Door # 3, on School Street) When arriving to NRHEG Elementary School all parents/visitors are expected to enter the building using the EAST ENTRANCE. The office staff will identify you on their camera and unlock the door allowing you to enter the school. ALL VISITORS MUST REGISTER IN THE OFFICE. YOU WILL THEN RECEIVE A VISITOR'S PASS BEFORE PROCEEDING TO AN EVENT OR CLASSROOM. This system will be in place from 8:30 a.m.-2:50 p.m. during each school day.

Bus Pick Up/Drop Off Locations in Ellendale To ensure that our students may safely travel to and from school, the district has identified the railroad tracks as a hazardous crossing. Therefore, there will be two pick up points for students living in Ellendale, one on each side of Highway 30.

North Pick Up in Ellendale Location: Southwest corner of 4th Street and 4th Ave. This is the location of the <u>former</u> United Methodist Church. Students are to wait on the sidewalk until the bus arrives.

South Pick Up in Ellendale Location: On the north side of 7th Avenue between 3rd and 4th Streets. This is the parking area for the Bonnerup Funeral Home.

SCHOOL DROP-OFF/Pick- up ZONE Enter from 8th Avenue (directly behind Al's Body Shop) and drop off/pick up your child at the south end of the sidewalk by Doors # 8 & 9. Please exit using the west entrance of the parking lot. In an effort to maintain student safety and to ease traffic, parents MUST use the south location as their pick up and drop off point. **Also students arriving for school are not to be dropped off or picked up in the north parking lot or on the east side of school during the hours of 7:30-8:30a.m. and 2:45-3:30 p.m. Students dropped off will not have access to entering the building until 7:45 a.m. Families will have the option to use our paid SAC (School Age Care) services that are available, but there is a fee associated with this service **

Important District Information

Title 1 Help Available K-5. Title I is a Federally Funded Program to provide supplemental help to students who need help in the basic skills of reading and/or math. Title I help is available to students in grades K-5 who need extra help in reading and/or math. Two Title 1 teachers and four paraprofessionals assist students with building reading and math skills. Minnesota Education Credits: Have you heard about the Minnesota K-12 Education Credits? If not, you may be missing out on money you're entitled to. These credits can lower your tax bill, and even mean a larger refund when you file your Minnesota Income Tax return.

Two programs to help you pay for school expenses. Minnesota has two programs to help families pay expenses to their child's education: the K-12 education subtraction and the K-12 education credit. The subtraction and credit are both based on the actual expenses you paid during the year to help your dependent child's K-12 education, so keep your original receipts for educational instruction and materials, showing how much you spent. You'll need them in order to receive these credits and subtraction.

What kind of expenses qualify? Most expenses paid for educational instruction or materials used during the normal school day qualify, including: school supplies (pencils, pens, notebooks, folders, etc.), tutoring fees, fees for after school enrichment programs, summer academic camp tuition, music lessons and musical instrumental rental, home computer hardware and educational software, and non-religious textbooks. Public, private, parochial or qualified home school expenses qualify.

Open House for grades 6-12, 4-8 p.m. Wednesday, August 30. Parents and students will have the opportunity to meet the staff, get student schedules, fill out paperwork, and attend general information sessions.

6th Grade Orientation will be held during the Open House at 6:30 p.m. in the upper commons. The Orientation program will last approximately 1.5 hours. Students and parents should enter through the east doors located on the ramp closest to the office, Door 1E.

At 9:05 a.m. there will be class meetings; 6th grade report to your 1st hour classroom, 7th grade in Mr. Berg's room, 8th grade in Mr. Domeier's room, 9th grade on the east side of gym bleachers, 10th grade in the band room, 11th grade in the lower commons, 12th grade in the choir room. HS locker assignments will be posted in the commons area. MS locker assignments will be posted on the fire doors by the office.

Interquest Detection Canines - School Detection and Deterrence Programs. NRHEG Schools have contracted the services of Interquest Canines. They will be providing random, unannounced visits. Their comprehensive detection and deterrence program has one objective: to reduce the presence of drugs, alcohol, abused medication and weapons on campus and school grounds. Secured Entrance at NRHEG Secondary. When arriving at NRHEG Secondary Building/District Office after 8:28 a.m. all students, parents and visitors are expected to enter the building using the main entrance on the east side of the building, Door 1E. After stepping through the first set of doors, you will need to turn to the right and ring the buzzer just to the left of the door. The office staff will then identify you on their camera and buzz (unlock) the door which will allow you to enter the office. ALL VISITORS MUST STOP AND REGISTER IN THE OFFICE. YOU WILL RECEIVE A VISITOR'S PASS BEFORE PROCEEDING INTO THE BUILDING. This system will be in place from 8:28 a.m.-3:05 p.m. each school day.

Important District Special Education Services Informatio

Minnesota Public Schools are required by law to provide a free, appropriate education to all children with handicaps birth through 22 years of age. As part of our district's commitment to this law, we encourage parents who have questions regarding special needs of their children to contact the Director of Special Education, Heather Harms, at 507-835-5046.

"Special Education" is instruction, specific to the child, at no cost to parents, to meet the unique needs of a child with a disability. It is important to note: Students with disabilities are general education students first. They receive special education support services in conjunction with the general education curriculum. Special education is an instructional service, not a place. Special education services must be reasonably calculated to allow the student to benefit from instruction. If the student is receiving benefit from the special education services, the student will progress at his/her own individual rate. A student who has a disability will always have the disability and would not be expected to progress in all areas at the same rate as his/her regular education peers.

To qualify for special education services a child must have a disability. The child must meet State eligibility criteria in one or more of the following areas:

- *Speech or Language Impairment
- *Visual Impairment
- *Deaf-Blindness
- *Developmental Delay (Birth to Age 7)
- *Developmental Cognitive Disability: Mild Moderate *Developmental Cognitive Disability: Severe-Profound
- *Physical Impairment
- *Specific Learning Disability
- *Other Health Disability
- *Traumatic Brain Injury

- *Deaf/Hard of Hearing
- *Emotional or Behavioral Disorder
- *Autism Spectrum Disorders
- *Severe Multiple Impairments

An evaluation is used to document the existence of a disability. Below average academic performance alone does not qualify a student for special education.

Each year, the district attempts to locate all children with handicaps through various methods such as articles in the local newspaper, radio spots, census takers and an annual Early Childhood screening program which screens children ages three (3) to five (5). The district also works very closely with the county social services, nursing agencies, local clinics, hospitals and through the Help Me Grow referral site.

Parents and students 18 years old or older have a right to inspect the student's records and can do so by making either a verbal or written request at the principal's or superintendent's office. A small fee may be charged if the parent desires copies. However, if the parent cannot pay this fee, the fee will not prevent the parent from receiving copies.

Public schools are considered government agencies and, in general, are subject to both State and Federal government record management laws. Record retention policies are decided by individual school boards that must adhere to these laws. Minnesota has a model School District General Retention Schedule, but this does not specify a set length of time for special education records. Destruction of records must be under a uniform policy adopted by the school board and approved by the Minnesota Records Disposition Panel. Parents must be notified prior to the destruction of the child's records. The special education confidential file (hard copy) is retained 5 years after which the student turns 22 years of age, including deceased students. At this time, the file will be destroyed. Parents or students who are age 18 or older will be informed of and receive the Notification of Special Education Records Retention and Destruction Policy upon entrance into special education and again at graduation/aging out of services.

Parents may file a complaint if they feel a disagreement has not been satisfactorily resolved. This complaint must be in writing and should be addressed to the principal of the building the student attends. If unresolved at this level, it should then be sent to the Superintendent. If still unresolved, it should be sent to the chairperson of the school board.

Section 504

Section 504 is a federal anti-discrimination law that protects the rights of individuals with disabilities in programs and activities that receive federal financial assistance from the U.S. Department of Education (29 USC §794.701 et seg.). Recipients of this federal financial assistance include public school districts, institutions of higher education, and other state and local education agencies. It requires a school district to provide a "free and appropriate education," (FAPE) to each qualified student with a disability who is in the recipient's jurisdiction, regardless of the nature or severity of the student's disability (34 C.F.R. § 104.33(a). Under Section 504, FAPE provides regular or special education and related aids and services that are designed to meet the needs of individuals with disabilities as adequately as the needs of individuals without disabilities are met. 34 C.F.R. § 104.33(b)(1)(i).

NRHEG is committed to fulfilling the obligations of the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA) and Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act. The district has systems in place to identify, evaluate and provide educational services to students with disabilities in a manner that is as similar to their non-disabled peers as deemed appropriate.

Parents and students have a right to request an evaluation if they suspect the student has a disability which affects their educational progress. Parents and students have a right to be part of the educational team that determines the methods of evaluation, the interpretation of the evaluation results and the development of the Individual Education Program (IEP) or 504 Plan should one be required. Parents and students who have questions regarding the process can contact the Special Education Office at 507-835-5046.

Auxiliary aids and services are available for school sponsored events. Please contact the school 72 hours prior to the event to make a request. Examples of auxiliary aids or services may include: sign language interpreter, assistive listening kit, accessible meeting location, large print or Braille materials, etc.

Important 2023-2024 School Year Environmental, Health & Safety Notices

NRHEG Schools continues to address environmental, health & safety (EHS) issues in a proactive manner. NRHEG Schools works with the Institute for Environmental Assessment (IEA) to provide safe and healthy environments for our community's youth and employees.

Asbestos--Each year, the Asbestos Hazard Emergency Response Act (AHERA) requires NRHEG Schools to provide an update on asbestos activities to building occupants.

Asbestos is a mineral fiber associated with increased levels of disease when inhaled. Properly maintained, asbestos containing materials pose no health hazard to building occupants. Asbestos is only dangerous when it is broken loose from building materials into fine, dust like fibers and inhaled.

Our asbestos management plan has been implemented as of July 9, 1989. Since that time, NRHEG Schools completes various activities to control asbestos hazards within the facilities. Periodic surveillances are conducted every six months to check for damage to the asbestos containing materials. Specially trained contractors repair damages identified. In addition to periodic surveillances, the buildings are re-inspected every three years. The purpose of the re-inspection is to have a federally certified asbestos inspector reassess the condition of the material. The most recent re-inspection was conducted April 2022, the next one is scheduled for Spring 2025.

The asbestos management plan is maintained in the district office and in the administrative offices of each building. It is available for review during school office hours.

Short-term workers (outside contractors, telephone repair workers, electricians, exterminators, etc.) shall be provided information regarding the location of asbestos in which they may come into contact. All short-term workers shall contact the Buildings and Ground Supervisor before commencing work to be given this information.

Indoor Air Quality--NRHEG Schools has developed a district-wide indoor air quality (IAQ) program designed to help ensure that the school provides a safe environment for students and staff. Each school in the district will be evaluated on an annual basis for potential indoor air quality problems.

The evaluation will include several steps. Ventilation systems will be examined to make sure they are functioning properly and providing adequate fresh air. Visual inspections will be conducted to determine the potential for mold growth. Cleaning practices will be reviewed to ensure that cleanliness is maintained and that the cleaning supplies used are safe yet effective. A portion of staff members will be interviewed annually regarding indoor air quality issues. If problems are found, they will be addressed appropriately.

Pest Control Materials--NRHEG Schools uses Ecolab, a licensed professional pest control service firm, for the prevention and control of rodents, insects, and other pests in and around the district's buildings. The program consists of:

- 1. Inspection and monitoring to determine whether pests are present and whether any treatment is needed.
- 2. Recommendations for maintenance and sanitation to help eliminate pests without the need for pest control measures.
- 3. Utilization of non-chemical measures such as traps, caulking, and screening.
- 4. Application of EPA-registered pest control materials when needed.

Pests can sting, bite, cause contamination, damage property, and spread disease; therefore, we must prevent and control them. The long-term health effects on children from the application of such pest control materials, or the class of materials to which they belong, may not be fully understood. All pest control materials are chosen and applied by a licensed, professional pest control service.

Along with pest control measures, NRHEG Schools applies herbicides and fertilizers to our grounds to control weeds and improve the quality of our grass.

Parents of students may request to receive prior notification of any application of a pest control material or herbicide. Any expenses associated with prior notification may be charged to the requesting parent.

Drinking Water Testing--NRHEG School District conducts testing in accordance with The Reduction of Lead in Drinking Water Act and the requirements of Minnesota Statutes, section 121A.335. This is conducted every five years. Any person interested in discussing the district Lead in Drinking Water program or results, please contact the district office for access to the documentation.

NRHEG Food Service Has Some Exciting News!!!

On Friday, March 17th, 2023, Governor Walz signed the Free School Meals bill into law. This means FREE breakfast and lunch to all students attending NRHEG starting in the 2023-2024 school year. This is a permanently funded program written into state law.

Please be aware that there will still be a charge for any second entrees or other A la carte food and beverage items.

NRHEG Schools will need to continue to collect Applications for Educational Benefits to determine if a student qualifies for free or reduced-price meals. You may ask why it is important to continue collecting Applications for Educational Benefits. A school's eligibility for programs such as the Summer Food Service Program (SFSP), which we are currently operating this summer, is based on free and reduced-price eligibility. Students and families may qualify for other program fee reductions based on their eligibility.

Farm-to-School Grant We are also thrilled to announce we were one of 114 schools awarded money from the MN Department of Agriculture. The Farm to School Full Tray Grant provided us with over \$53,000 to purchase local foods grown and raised in Minnesota for the 2023-24 school year.

Last year, Farm to School awarded us \$5,000. With that grant money, we were able to offer students fresh veggies, fruits, honey, maple syrup, and ground beef, all locally sourced from our area!

This funding not only increases access to our local foods but expands market opportunities for emerging farmers in the state and supports the development of relationships between our local farmers and schools.




