What is Early Childhood Education and why is it so important?

Simply put, Early Childhood Education (ECE) is considered the official term for teaching young kids. More specifically, it refers to formal and informal educational programs that guide the growth and development of children throughout their preschool years (birth to age five).

ECE encompasses a wide variety of activities designed to promote children's cognitive and social development before entering kindergarten. Some programs primarily focus on school and academic readiness while others embrace a "whole child" approach that emphasizes mental and emotional preparedness.

The purpose of ECE is to provide children with strategies that help them develop the emotional, social and cognitive skills needed to become lifelong learners.

The following skills are considered to be the most important for young learners to master: language and literacy, thinking, self-control, and self-confidence. ECE curriculums are set up to encourage young students to learn about themselves and the world via experiences. This could include indoor or outdoor play, cooperative or individual play, dramatic play, sensory play, and constructive play to name just a few!

There is a large body of research that suggests a high-quality ECE program can have a positive long-term effect on the lives of children. The National Education Association (NEA) states that research shows children who receive a high-quality education before they turn five enjoy significant medium- and long-term benefits. Children in early childhood education programs are:

- Less likely to repeat a grade
- Less likely to be identified as having special needs
- More prepared academically for later grades
- More likely to graduate from high school
- More likely to be higher earners in the workforce

Here at NRHEG Community Education we offer a variety of early learning programs and classes. Please take the time to look through each of our four NRHEG District Brochures that are mailed to you throughout the year to find different activities and classes not only for your young learner, but for everyone!

But the District Census?? Community Education activities & programs are funded in a variety of ways including state aid and local levy dollars based on a funding formula established by the Minnesota State Legislature (which is why it is *extremely important to fill out your school district census* form (page 7) when there is a new birth in your family or when you move into town – a portion of our funding is based on the census!), participant fees (enrichment, recreation, early childhood family education (ECFE), driver education, special events, School Age Care, and Preschool), grants, donations, and other local sources.

Even though most of our classes & activities are fee based, we have a wide range of scholarships and sliding fee scales that are available so all children are able to participate in the activities we are proud to offer!

IS YOUR FAMILY INCLUDED ON THE SCHOOL DISTRICT CENSUS?

Has there been a birth in your family? Have you recently moved into your neighborhood? Is there a new family in your neighborhood? ISD 2168 wants all families with young children to know about our programs and activities. Being on the school census also ensures that you will receive information regarding Early Childhood Family Education classes, Early Childhood Screening, and the Panther Preschool program information. In addition, funding for our Early Childhood Programs is based on the number of children on our census.

It is important that everyone be counted! To be added to the census, please call Karla at our school office, 417-2605 or find the form on our Community Education Website at www.nrheg.k12.mn.us under the community education tab.

Early childhood screening is mandated by the State of Minnesota for all children entering Kindergarten. The best time to have your child screened is between the ages of 3 and 4.

• Help Me Grow is an interagency initiative of the State of Minnesota Department of Education, Department of Health and Department of Human Services. We partner with all local service. agencies.

Early Childhood Screening is FREE and the earlier the BETTER! When your child turns 3, please call 507-417-2667 to schedule a screening appointment. This information is needed by NRHEG Public Schools in order to keep accurate records and counts for children ages 0-5 living in the school district. Please make sure to submit this information on all newborns and preschool age children living in the household.

What is ECFE? Early Childhood Family Education (ECFE) is a NRHEG Public Schools program that provides parenting information and support to families whose children are birth to five years old (not yet enrolled in kindergarten). A variety of classes, pre-school options, and activities are offered for all age groups. Most ECFE classes follow a similar format: parent/child activity time followed by parent education time to discuss common concerns and experiences while their children participate in an early childhood classroom. School readiness skills and activities are an important part of all programming.



What does a typical ECFE class include?

Parent-Child Activity Time: Families explore a classroom filled with developmentally appropriate play materials and learning activities planned by a licensed early childhood teacher. These experiences foster a child's social, emotional, cognitive, physical, and language skills.

Parent Education Time: Parents meet with a licensed parent educator to share support, experiences, and information about child development and parenting techniques. Research on early brain development, parent-child relationships, child development, and guidance techniques are presented in ECFE classes.

Children's Activity Time: Children learn with the early childhood teacher and practice social skills as they interact with one another.

Adventures In Parenting This multi-age class focuses on a variety of family issues and activities. Topics covered in parent discussion time are determined through discussion of parent needs/interests, current research, and teacher suggestions including child development, school readiness, temperament, guiding behavior, and sibling relationships. During separation from parents, children interact with the Early Childhood staff and other children and typically have a snack, crafts, stories, music, and more time playing with peers. These classes are for preschoolers aged 2½ -5 years old and their parents, grandparents, or caregivers.

WINTER 2023 Session Classes will be held in the evenings in the New Richland or Ellendale Preschool classrooms. \$15 per family. Class locations may rotate between Ellendale and New Richland depending on participants' preferences.

Tuesday October 3rd our first class will be located in New Richland at the Secondary School in room #C115 at 5:45-7:15pm (enter southeast playground doors #2S). As a group, we will then pick an additional 6 days/times for the remainder of our classes based on our participant's schedules!



NRHEG CLAY TARGET TEAM

Grades: 6-12. Available in both fall and spring, this league is for students who have a valid gun safety certificate and have an interest in shooting sports. This is the fastest growing high school sport in MN! The State Class Championship represents the largest youth trap shoot in the nation and the MSHSL State Tournament is currently the only one of its kind in the nation.

Fall League: begins in mid-September and goes for 6 weeks with no state shoot at the end. It's a great way for students to introduce themselves to the sport before the Spring League. Registration for the Fall League begins in August so being on the mailing list before school starts is very important. Shoots are held at the Owatonna Gun Club. Registration covers 2 rounds of targets per week for the 6-week season, the cost of league registration, a meal at our fun shoot, and a team shirt.

Spring League: involves weekly shoots one night per week starting the first week of April and going through the MSHSL State Tournament in late June. Shoots are held at the Owatonna Gun Club. Registration covers 2 rounds of targets per week for the 10-week season, the cost of league registration, state shoot registration, a meal at our fun shoot, and a team shirt. *All students provide their own firearms, ammunition, and safety gear. Students from neighboring school districts without a team or who are home schooled are also welcome to join us!*

Parent's Supplemental Course For students enrolled in Driver's Education

If you are the "primary driving supervisor" who will supervise a teen driver for the majority of their required driving hours, you will benefit from this 90 minute class. Effective January 1st 2016, every driver under the age of 18 who completes behind the wheel instruction and is testing for a provisional driver's license must submit a driving log.

Parent/guardians have two options regarding the supervised driving log:

1. Complete this supplemental parent class and then submit a supervised driving log showing their teen has completed at least 40 hours (2,400 minutes) of supervised driving, 15 (900 minutes) of which are night time hours

2. If the parent/guardian chooses to not complete this supplemental parent class, the driving log must show that their teen has completed at least 50 hours (3,000 minutes) of supervised driving, 15 (900 minutes) of which are night time hours.

This course will cover the graduated driving license law information, safety risks for teen drivers, potential adult influence on teen driving behavior, and additional resources. THIS CLASS IS NOT MANDATORY.

Class dates and information will be announced during the classroom portion of Driver's Ed. *Flyers will be sent home with your student*.

NRHEG Food Service 2023-24

On March 17, 2023, Governor Walz signed the MN Free School Meals bill into law. The MN Free School Meals Program is a permanent program that provides state reimbursement to schools that participate in the National School Lunch Program and the School Breakfast Program. This means that all students will receive one breakfast and one lunch at no cost. Please note that full meals are free but seconds, a la carte items or an extra milk will still be charged to the family account.

It is still important for families to complete the Application for Educational Benefits (Free and Reduced Forms). Applications for Educational Benefits determine how much funding our school receives for educational programs. Students and families may also qualify for other program fee reductions based on their eligibility.
