1. **From Miles Otstot:** "The band program has had another successful month. We had 8 students selected for a junior high held in Austin on March 17 (three 6th graders, four 7th graders, and one 8th graders). We had two students, Betsy Schoenrock and Eva Wayne, perform at the care center at the end of March, which went very well and was much appreciated by the residents there. Finally, we received 3 superior ratings at contest for Jadyn Surat's trumpet solo, Michiah VanSyckel's euphonium solo, and a sax quartet of Justin Mortensen, Karennia Strom, MacKayla Knutson, and Chris Stenzel."

2. **From Mr. Sorum:** "We are getting a \$2000 grant from the 761 Foundation next year to purchase animal and plant models for the Ag dept and the FFA is getting a \$1500 grant from CFS to purchase some hydroponic towers."

3. **From Mrs. Bently:** Of this year's 14 speech team participants, eight people (three "duo" pairs and two individual competitors) advanced to section-level competition, which took place Friday, April 7. We are finishing one of the most dynamic and successful speech seasons in a decade, and it's been quite a ride.
