

# DISTRICT OPPORTUNITIES

On April 9, 2019, residents in the New Richland-Hartland-Ellendale-Geneva (NRHEG) School District will have the opportunity to vote on a \$9.1 million referendum. The vote, which will take place at the Elementary and Secondary Schools, will determine whether the District will be able to make improvements to its two school facilities and the results will impact all community members. # What Will Be on the Ballot?

This referendum ballot will include one question. If approved at the polls, \$9.1 million will be authorized for District-wide improvements. Funding will be spread across a wide range of projects that satisfy curriculum and operational needs.

Shall the School Board of Independent School District No. 2168, NRHEG Public Schools, be authorized to issue its general obligation school building bonds in an amount not to exceed \$9,100,000.00 to provide funds for the acquisition and betterment of school sites and facilities, including safety and security improvements at the Elementary School; infrastructure improvements and completion of various deferred maintenance projects at school sites and facilities; completion of Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) accessibility improvements; and the completion of construction, renovation, expansion, or maintenance of classrooms, labs, restrooms, and other instructional spaces at school sites and facilities?

## Ag2School Government Tax Credit

In the past, rural schools faced challenges to fund improvements. To help these efforts, the State of Minnesota implemented the Ag2School tax credit with bipartisan support. This reduces the financial burden on farmers in the area. It offsets 40% of bond debt that is levied on agricultural taxpayers.


This permanent bill does not have a sunset clause, meaning there is no end date and that the bill will be effective for the entirety of the bond. Repealing this law is highly unlikely, as it would require both houses of Congress and the governor's approval to do so. Moreover, repealing this bipartisan law would be a vote for raising taxes, which both parties would likely avoid given the political consequences of such a vote.




